Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by **Chair Motz** at approximately 10:05 a.m. A meeting quorum was established with ten (10) out of eleven (11) members present.

Chair's Remarks

Chair Motz welcomed everyone, particularly guests, to today's meeting to hear presentations from Maryland's higher education segments. She asked the Commissioners to introduce themselves, and she gave an overview of the meeting agenda.

Public Comments

There were no public comments.

<u>Department of Finance and Administration – Operating and Capital Budget Presentations</u> <u>– Information Items</u>

Chair Motz welcomed all the representatives from the various segments of higher education who are here today to present their budget plans for fiscal year 2025. The Commission has a responsibility to review the budgets of all higher education segments. Institutions will also explain how their priorities and budgets align with the State Plan, as well as answer any questions submitted ahead of time by the Commissioners.

University System of Maryland

Ms. Ellen Herbst, Senior Vice Chancellor for Administration and Finance, and Dr. Alison Wrynn, Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs, presented the USM Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The presentation is available for review.

St. Mary's College of Maryland

Dr. Katherine Gantz, Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of Faculty, and Mr. Paul Pusecker, Vice President for Business & Chief Financial Officer, presented the St. Mary's College of Maryland Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The presentation is available for review.

Morgan State University

Dr. David Wilson, President, and Mr. David LaChina, Interim Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration, presented the Morgan State University Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The presentation is available for review.

Maryland Association of Community Colleges

Dr. Brad Phillips, Executive Director, presented the Maryland Association of Community Colleges Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The presentation is available for review.

Baltimore City Community College

Dr. Debra McCurdy, President, Mr. Aubrey Bascombe, Vice President for Finance and Administration, Mr. Michael Thomas, Vice President for Workforce and Continuing Education, and Ms. Eileen Hawkins, Director of Institutional Research, presented the Baltimore City Community College Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The presentation is available for review.

Regional Higher Education Centers

Mr. Geoffrey Newman, MHEC's Assistant Secretary for Finance and Administration, along with the Center Directors, presented the Regional Higher Education Centers' Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The Directors present were Mr. Justin Sayre of the Universities of La Plata, Ms. Marcella Leach of the Eastern Shore Higher Education Center, and Mr. Marcus Wright of the Anne Arundel Community College at Arundel Mills Higher Education Center. The presentation is available for review.

Maryland Independent College and University Association

Mr. Matthew Power, President, presented the Maryland Independent College and University Association Operating and Capital Budget to the Commission. The presentation is available for review.

Break 2:15 – 2:20 PM.

<u>Review Meeting – Proposal of Stevenson University for a Doctor of Physical Therapy</u> (DPT) Degree Program

(Present, both in-person and virtually, were 9 out of 11 total Commissioners. A quorum was met. Those present at the review meeting included: Aguh, Burnim, Howe, Motz, Robinson, Serrano, Taber Staehelin, Thompson, and Wormack. Dukes and Williams were absent.)

Chair Motz gave an overview of the review meeting. Stevenson University (SU) proposed a Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program, which was later recommended for implementation by MHEC's Assistant Secretary for Academic Affairs. The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) and the University of Maryland Baltimore (UMB) both objected and requested a review of the decision by the Commission.

Chair Motz recognized Dr. Emily Dow, MHEC's Assistant Secretary for Academic Affairs, to present her rationale for her decision. A careful analysis by agency staff revealed that duplication did exist. (The program objectives are similar.) However, the duplication was reasonable for several reasons. Market demand for DPT programs in Maryland is high. There is also unmet market demand for graduates of DPT programs. Additionally, SU's role in Maryland higher education, as a private institution, is distinct. Dr. Dow cited as well the recent retraction of a 2021 letter by ACAPT (American Council of Academic Physical Therapy), which urged institutions to limit the growth of DPT programs. The proposed program by Stevenson University would, therefore, not cause demonstrable harm to the existing programs at UMES and UMB. The Commissioners asked questions of Dr. Dow.

Chair Motz recognized USM's Dr. Wrynn who urged that future changes to the academic program review process be made with the students in mind. Dr. Bruce Jarrell, President of the University of Maryland Baltimore, asked the Commissioners to oppose Stevenson University's proposed program and overturn the decision made by the Assistant Secretary. Dr. Roger Ward, UMB's Provost, noted that their institution is focused on graduate and professional education.

The proposed program would cause demonstrable harm to UMB's program. SU's program could not be successful without directly competing with them for resources, particularly faculty and clinical sites. Dr. Victoria Marchese, Chair of the Department of Physical Therapy and Rehabilitative Science, added that the current supply of physical therapists is outpacing demand. The Commissioners asked questions about UMB's presentation.

Chair Motz recognized Dr. Heidi Anderson, President of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, who urged the Commission to overturn the Assistant Secretary's decision. Dr. Michael Rabel, Professor and Chair of the Department of Physical Therapy, noted that theirs was a unique, high-demand program. However, there is already a projected surplus of physical therapists without adding new programs. Additionally, there have been attempts to work with SU, but their efforts to reach out received no response. Dr. Tadas Vasaitis, Assistant Dean, cited an overall shortage of faculty that would be exacerbated with the addition of SU's program in the state. The Commissioners asked questions about UMES's presentation.

Chair Motz recognized Dr. Dow for rebuttal comments. The Assistant Secretary noted that the licensing data provided today were not available at the time of her review and decision.

Chair Motz recognized UMB for responsive remarks. Dr. Jarrell remarked that they chose not to expand their program due to decreased demand. Dr. Marchese added that they currently have only 24 individuals on their wait list.

Chair Motz recognized UMES for responsive remarks. Dr. Rabel reported that they have not had a waitlist for the past 2 years. In addition, they have not been able to fill their recent cohort completely.

Chair Motz recognized Dr. Elliot Hirshman, President of Stevenson University, who stated that their proposed program is not unreasonably duplicative of the existing programs and urged the Commission to affirm the decision of the Assistant Secretary. Dr. Hannah Hughes, Dean of the School of Nursing & Health Professions, remarked that there is a demand for physical therapists in the state and nationally. Dr. Susan Gorman, Provost, added that there are not enough physical therapists to meet demand. There are many unfilled jobs. Ms. Antionette Marbray, Vice President of Legal Affairs and Government Relations, highlighted the need for physical therapists in their particular community. Dr. Merrie Durmowicz, Dean of the School of the Sciences, noted that they have secured clinical placements from sites that do not currently work with UMB and UMES. The Commissioners asked questions about SU's presentation.

Chair Motz remarked that the Commission will now go into a closed session for the purpose of carrying out an administrative function and to receive legal advice. **Commissioner Burnim** made a motion and **Commissioner Thompson** seconded the motion to go into a closed session. **Chair Motz** called the roll:

CLOSED SESSION: During the Maryland Higher Education Commission's regular meeting on September 13, 2023, at 10:00 a.m., held in the 7th floor boardroom of the Nancy S. Grasmick Education Building, 200 W. Baltimore St., Baltimore, Maryland, with some Commissioners joining virtually via video conference, the Commission voted to move into closed session. Pursuant to §§ 3-301(a) and 3-305(b)(7) of the General Provisions Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, and upon motion of Commissioner Howe, seconded by Commissioners were in closed session on Wednesday, September 13, 2023, in person, in a conference room adjoining the 7th floor boardroom, for the purpose of reviewing an academic program proposal pursuant to Title 11 of the Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland and to receive legal advice from counsel regarding academic program review. The following Commission members were not present for the vote: Charlene Dukes and Craig Williams.

The Executive Session commenced at approximately 4:45 p.m. In attendance in person at closed session were Commissioners Cassie Motz, Chike Aguh, Mickey Burnim, Barbara Howe, Sheila Thompson, and Janet Wormack; and Assistant Attorney General Soma Kedia. Commissioners Ray Serrano, Rebecca Taber Staehelin, and Cierra Robinson joined the closed session by phone.

The topic of discussion at the closed session was the Assistant Secretary's decision to recommend for implementation Stevenson University's proposed Doctorate in Physical Therapy program under COMAR 13B.02.03.28. The Commission also received legal advice on the criteria for program review in COMAR 13B.02.03. The action taken during the closed session was to overturn the Assistant Secretary's decision to recommend the proposed degree program.

The action was approved by seven Commissioners. The motion to overturn the Acting Secretary's decision was made by Commissioner Howe and seconded by Commissioner Burnim. The following Commissioners voted in favor of the motion: Chike Aguh, Mickey Burnim, Barbara Howe, Cassie Motz, Cierra Robinson, Sheila Thompson, and Janet Wormack. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by **Chair Motz** at approximately 10:03 a.m. A meeting quorum was established with ten (10) out of eleven (11) members present.

Chair's Remarks

Chair Motz welcomed everyone to today's meeting. She expressed support for the schools, Bowie State University and Morgan State University, where mass shootings recently took place. She and Acting Secretary Rai have been in touch with the leadership of those schools, and are planning a campus safety summit on December 4. The event will be planned in conjunction with the University System of Maryland (USM). Additionally, the agency will host a virtual financial aid open house on November 10. The event will, in particular, feature the recent changes made to the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). Chair Motz then gave an overview of the meeting agenda.

Acting Secretary's Remarks

Acting Secretary Rai thanked everyone for attending today's meeting. He mentioned also the campus safety summit and the virtual financial aid open house. MHEC wants to make the financial aid process easier for students, so they can focus on their education and career.

Public Comments

There were no public comments.

<u>Department of Finance and Administration – Office of Finance Policy – FY 2025 Higher</u> <u>Education State Operating Budget Recommendations – Action Item</u>

Chair Motz recognized Mr. Geoffrey Newman, Assistant Secretary for Finance and Administration, to present this item. Mr. Newman introduced his colleagues, Mr. Samuel Pandian, Director of Budget and Administration, and Mr. Al Dorsett, Director of the Office of Student Financial Assistance, both of whom assisted in the presentation. The Maryland Higher Education Commission is charged with submitting to the Governor and the General Assembly a consolidated operating budget for higher education. The consolidated budget is to include a recommendation regarding the appropriate level of funding for higher education in order to achieve the goals established in the Maryland State Plan for Postsecondary Education. The State provided over \$3.2 billion in State funds to higher education in fiscal 2024. 72.2 percent was provided to public four-year institutions. The administration budget for MHEC received 2.2 percent of the total. The Commission received over \$183 million in general fund and special fund support for student financial assistance in fiscal 2024.

Mr. Newman recommended that the Maryland Higher Education Commission adopt the following funding priorities be used in targeting funding for higher education for Fiscal Year 2025:

- Funding to support the Maryland Higher Education Commission General Administration budget as it continues to implement new programs, add new staff, modify existing programs, and examine its operations to increase automation of application and management programs.
- Funding to support new programs of student financial assistance and changes to existing programs brought forward by the Governor and General Assembly as well as to support the development of a new financial aid system.
- Continued support to formula-funded institutions and segments in line with the appropriations provided to the public four-year colleges and universities in accordance with the calculation methodologies provided in statute to the extent possible.

The Commissioners asked questions about the presentation. **Commissioner Howe** made a motion to approve the recommendations and **Commissioner Serrano** seconded the motion. **Commissioner Dukes** abstained. The motion passed.

<u>Department of Finance and Administration – Office of Finance Policy – FY 2025</u> <u>Consolidated Capital Budget Recommendations – Action Item</u>

Chair Motz recognized Mr. Newman who asked Mr. Daniel Schuster, Finance Policy Analyst, to present the FY 2025 Consolidated Capital Budget Recommendations. The seven segments of the Consolidated Capital Budget for Higher Education include: (1) the Community College Construction Grant Program; (2) Community College Facilities Renewal Grant Program; (3) Baltimore City Community College; (4) University System of Maryland; (5) Morgan State University; (6) St. Mary's College of Maryland; and (7) Maryland Independent College & University Association. Their requests total \$604,266,500. Mr. Schuster gave an overview of each submission and made the following recommendations:

- 1) The Commission staff recommends approval of the \$80,000,000 planned in the CIP (Capital Improvement Plan) for the Community College Construction Grant Program.
- 2) The Commission staff recommends approval of the Community College Facilities Renewal Grant funding request of \$4,000,000, consistent with statutory formula.
- The Commission staff recommends approval of FY 2025 funding for projects planned in the CIP for Baltimore City Community College, the University System of Maryland, Morgan State University, and St. Mary's College of Maryland.
- 4) The Commission staff recommends redirecting planned funds to deferred maintenance if not needed for other planned projects.
- 5) The Commission staff recommends approval of the \$8,000,000 planned in the CIP for the MICUA FY 2025 capital budget.

Commissioner Howe made a motion to approve the recommendations, and **Commissioner Burnim** seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

State Completion Goal – Discussion and Presentation by HCM Strategists

Chair Motz recognized **Acting Secretary Rai** who asked Ms. Martha Snyder, Dr. Jimmy Clarke, and Mr. William Carroll of HCM Strategists to present this item. The team shared a PowerPoint presentation. Maryland's current attainment goal is 55% of all Maryland adults (age 25 to 64) will hold at least an associate's degree by 2025. Currently, Maryland is projected to fall short of this goal (52% by 2025). Some states that recently updated their goals have included non-degree credentials. The example of Texas and its goal was shared. 60% of Texans (ages 25-64) will receive a degree, certificate or other postsecondary credential of value by 2030. The team also shared the process and steps taken to develop a goal, including engaging various stakeholders in the conversation. The next steps will include convening a leadership team to guide the work, as well as engaging institutional leaders and different stakeholders to provide input. The entire process will take about a year. The Commissioners asked questions of the presenters.

Election of Vice Chair

Chair Motz shared that Commissioner Aguh indicated his interest in serving as Vice Chair. Commissioner Howe nominated Commissioner Aguh to be the Commission Vice Chair and Commissioner Taber Staehelin seconded the nomination. The nomination was approved unanimously.

Adjournment

Commissioner Burnim made a motion to adjourn the meeting and **Vice Chair Aguh** seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at approximately 12:46 PM.

The Community College Construction Grant Program provides State assistance for the construction and improvement of facilities at community colleges. This grant funds the construction of major new facilities, renovation of existing facilities, and improvements to campus infrastructure.

The level of State participation in capital projects for the community colleges is determined by two criteria: the portion of the project that meets the space eligibility requirements for State support, and the State and local cost-sharing formula prescribed in statute and calculated by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE). MSDE uses this cost-sharing formula to calculate the State's share in providing financial assistance for public education. The formula is based on a current expense calculation that considers the enrollment of students in elementary and secondary schools and county wealth (e.g. net taxable income, the assessed valuation of real property, and the assessed value of personal property).

Based on this cost-sharing formula, the State contributes between 50 percent and 70 percent of the eligible costs of a project for single-county-operated community colleges and 75 percent of the eligible costs of a project for regional community colleges. The table on the next page shows the percentage of State share for newly introduced projects in the Fiscal Year 2026 community college capital budget request.

- c. Unreasonable program duplication which would cause demonstrable harm to another institution; or
- d. Violation of the State's equal educational opportunity obligations under State and federal law.

The annual Performance Accountability Report (PAR) serves as an important mechanism by which public colleges and universities in Maryland are held accountable. Through a performance accountability plan, institutions are required to establish and maintain performance standards and use metrics to assess their effectiveness in tackling institutional and statewide higher education goals. Every year, the governing board of each public institution of higher education¹ is required to submit a written report to the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) on the institution's progress in attaining the objectives in the performance accountability plan. This summative statewide report includes highlights from Maryland's public institutions' submissions for the 2022-2023 academic year reporting cycle.

The 2022-2023 Performance Accountability Report summarizes institution's progress toward the three key goals of the 2022 State Plan for Higher Education. In summary, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on undergraduate enrollment of Maryland higher education universities and colleges has diminished. For public four-year institutions, the undergraduate enrollment and enrollment of minority students have recovered slowly. Student retention rates decreased but are still on track to meet the institutional benchmarks. However, some concerning patterns of inequity in student success outcomes and graduation are observed. Community colleges show promising progress toward maintaining and increasing high school enrollments (dual enrollment and early/middle college). The labor market outcomes for community college graduates has improved from the last reporting cycle. However, community colleges still face challenges in meeting benchmarks of credit and non-credit enrollments. Academic achievement gaps still exist for underrepresented students; the gaps in graduation-transfer rates among minority groups widened for some community colleges after the pandemic.

Last year, the Commission raised some concerns about inequities in student success and how institutions hold themselves accountable to equitably achieve the objectives of the Maryland State Plan for Higher Education. Therefore, the Commission requested that institutions deepen the discussion on issues of equity in their narrative report submissions for the 2023 PAR;

institutions provided responses to questions tied to: 1) how institutions identify long-term equity gaps; and 2) how institutions measure their long-term equity gaps.

In short, institutions noted that gaps in student success, such as retention and graduation mostly occur for racially or socioeconomically underrepresented students. The equity gaps are usually identified by disaggregated data and campus climate surveys. Offices of institutional research usually play a central role in collecting and disseminating the data. The findings on equity gap analyses are usually shared within an institution's community, which includes administration, staff, faculty, and students. Most institutions set benchmarks to eliminate the equity gaps and implement various interventions to improve the equity. The full performance accountability report provides a more detailed summary of the institution's responses.

In the coming year, MHEC will continue to partner with institutions to make sure students in Maryland receive high-quality postsecondary education consistently. MHEC will be evaluating important workforce trends and developing new completion goals to replace the 55% by 2025 goal. These conversations and initiatives will be developed with an explicit eye towards inequities specific to access and success in higher education. Institutions will need to be far more strategic in supporting students who enroll to fulfill their commitment to student success.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: It is recommended that the Maryland Higher Education Commission approve the 2023 Performance Accountability Report and ask the Acting Secretary to forward it to the Governor and the General Assembly as required by law.
